

About the campground



Aliso Park is the closest access to the Los Padres National Forest from New Cuyama. Primarily used as a campground there is not an extensive trail system. However, Aliso is perfect for that quick getaway into the wilderness. At the far end of the campground there is a wide, well maintained trail that wanders past hills with minimal elevation gain. Partially shaded, this trail is great for hot days. The trail is 2 miles long and at the end there is a large clearing. For a longer hike you can continue onto a trail that is located here. A little harder to find, this trail is unmarked and will bring you up to Forest Route 32S13. A second trail can also be found at the campground, although this trail is unmarked and it recommended for experienced hikers only.

Directions from New Cuyama

Turn left off Perkins Rd onto Highway 166. In 2.4 miles turn left onto Aliso Canyon Rd. After 3.8 miles take a sharp right onto Foothill Rd. The campground is located 2.4 miles down Foothil! Rd.
